Joan called the meeting to order and welcomed 2 visitors. 28 people were in attendance. Joan shared an inspirational thought. "Every day you wake up is a gift." Enrollment forms were distributed for the new year and how the money is allocated was discussed. Those who had money for dues paid tonight, but dues should be submitted by the September meeting. Treasurer's report was given by Pat Miller. Pat's leg has healed nicely.

Birthdays were recognized.

Project day was last Thursday, and they made table runners. There was some discussion about which Thursday project days should be held. It is not the first Thursday of the month but the Thursday after the regular monthly meeting. The next project day will be Sept. 7th and we will be making sewing aprons with Garnetta. The regular meeting for September will be held on Tuesday the 5th because of Labor Day. The date for the Bazaar has been changed to Oct 21st and will be held at the extension building. Donated items should be dropped off by Monday October 16th if possible. Volunteers will be needed, and a signup will be provided. Shifts will be from 8am to 11:30 to 11:30 to 3pm. Any unsold items will need to be picked up at 3 or at the extension office the following week. A flyer will be made and sent out to all members and to local businesses. Marketing will start mid-September and will be promoted by The Chamber of Commerce. Baked goods may be sold as well, and 2nd Saturday Sew was asked to provide an opportunity gift basket along with the others that have already been planned. They will do a Halloween theme. All members are encouraged to participate in bringing items to sell. All money will go to the Anderson County Extension Homemakers, that the Quilt Guild is a part of.

Subsequent Proclamations declared that "Tens of millions of Americans sew at home. Their efforts demonstrate the industry, the skill and the self-reliance which are so characteristic of this Nation."

National Sewing Month is the recognition of a creative form of self-expression that we celebrate in September but enjoy all year. The month-long Open House of retailers, bloggers, online stores, schools, organizations, individuals and more is a great time to renew interest, share ideas, be inspired, expand your knowledge and express your creativity. September is National Happy Cat Month!

- September 4 Labor Day
- September 11 Patriot Day, held in honor and remembrance of those who dies in the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks.

- September 11 National Hug Your Hound Day
- September 13 Kids take over the Kitchen Day
